Carlow Arts Festival 2023

Join us in the grounds of Carlow College, St. Patrick's, from Wed 7 to Sun 11 June.

In 2022, our festival programme attracted over 22,500 attendees to a diverse array of events, as we were able to gather in person once more. We are grateful for the crucial and ongoing support of our funders, artists, audiences and participants, year-on-year.

From music to visual and performing arts, theatre, dance, spectacle, literature, and beyond, this year's programme is vibrant, challenging and full of surprise.

On stage at VISUAL, we present Irish premieres of three works from European artists who blur the boundaries between artforms; it's our modest way of celebrating 50 years of EU membership in 2023.

From Belgium, Dag Taeldeman's and Andrew Van Ostade's electrifying BodyBodyBodyBody is a journey to the edge of trance, rooted in the folk traditions of the Italian tarantella. In MOS, Greece's Ioanna Paraskevopoulou appropriates seemingly random objects, including bellows, a coconut, and a plunger, to conjure up cinematic soundtracks in a playfully captivating dance. And we present Sorry, But I Feel Slightly Disidentified..., a provocative performance piece created by Benjamin Kahn (France/Belgium) in collaboration with the incredible Dutch performer Cherish Menzo.

Other highlights include Unqualified Design Studio's *Without Sin*, a contemporary confessional for the modern sinner that cultivates a space for intimate conversations and 2023's ARTWORKS in VISUAL, *Remembering the Future*, which features a complete exhibition of the Irish Names Project's AIDS Memorial quilts.

At the O'Hara's Quarter you can catch some of Ireland's most acclaimed up-and-coming music artists, including rising Irish hip-hop star Jafaris, folk singer and multi-instrumentalist John Francis Flynn, and the genre-defying Æ MAK on the Main Stage, and the best music talent from County Carlow on the O'Hara's Live & Local Stage.

Carlow Arts Festival is a welcoming space for children and young people to experience the wonder of the arts, inspiring them to explore their own creativity. We present performances that will ignite imaginations of all ages. Highlights include Bombinate Theatre's charming show for little ones Goodnight Egg and Wires, Strings & Other Things, a performance that explores the mystery of how musicians compose and improvise.

We are thrilled that Cruinniú na nÓg, Ireland's national day of creativity for children and young people, again coincides with our festival. We've a fantastic programme of free creative activities, both on Saturday and on Sunday. The highlight will be the second Carnival of Collective Joy, co-created with the children of Carlow, which explodes onto the streets of Carlow Town on Saturday.

The carnival is one of a number of projects from our year-round arts participation and community engagement strand ASSEMBLY that comes to fruition at the festival. Through ASSEMBLY, we bring communities and artists together to collaborate on innovative, interdisciplinary arts projects. In 2023, we also present *The Long and Short of It*, the culmination of a project developed with older community members. This beautiful exhibition of animated stories brings to life deeply personal memories and rich social histories. Other ASSEMBLY events include *Cycles: Spokes*, a series of discussions about our sense of place within County Carlow and *Roots*, a space for playful creativity.

This year's programme presents work that is vital and visceral, thoughtful and thought-provoking — as purposeful as it is joyful. We welcome everyone to share in this collective experience, as we seek to open up a space for jubilation and concentration, entertainment and reflection.

2023's ARTWORKS exhibition, Remembering the Future, considers time, and the ability of memories, real or imagined, to collapse past, present, and future together.

The artworks in the exhibition explore memory and imagination as utopian tools for dreaming different worlds and for preserving the past.



The exhibition includes invited and commissioned works along with Irish and international artists selected through VISUAL and Carlow Arts Festival's annual ARTWORKS Open Call.

The first complete exhibition in a gallery setting of the Irish Names Project's AIDS Memorial quilts is the anchor point of the season. The quilts represent the lives of those affected by the AIDS epidemic.

Remembering the Future also includes a new large-scale commission and existing works by Sinéad Kennedy from her ongoing Grandland project, and Brianna Hurley's Castalia, paintings of a planet whose people have been oppressed by a conquering force.

Five ARTWORKS Prizes of €1000 each for outstanding pieces of work from promising practices will be presented at the exhibition launch at VISUAL on Thursday 8 of June at 6pm. All welcome.



THE LONG AND SHORT OF IT

Assembly

This exhibition is the culmination of a year-long community engagement project developed by Carlow Arts Festival with older community members (65+) from Rathvilly, Hacketstown, Myshall and Graiguecullen.

In each area, over seven-weeks of workshops, our participants collaborated with writer Darren Donohue, director Janice de Bróithe, artist Paul Bokslag, and animator and sound designer Seán Parnell to create animated stories inspired by their personal memories and their community's social histories.

This exhibition features the animations, the original papercuts, scripts, and community artefacts.

Voiced by the participants, these beautiful and evocative papercut animations bring to life deeply personal memories of communities gathering for the threshing at harvest-time, children swimming in the River Barrow and young couples dancing to showbands.

The Long and Short of It is part of ASSEMBLY, Carlow Arts Festival's year-round arts participation and engagement programme.

Vital Signs, published by Poetry Ireland and edited by Martin Dyar, features a selection of poems by some of the most respected writers of our time, including Eavan Boland, Paula Meehan, and Paul Muldoon.

MOS

Ioanna Paraskevopoulou (Greece)

In MOS, Ioanna Paraskevopoulou and Georgios Kotsifakis create a physical soundtrack before our very eyes, using everyday tools to score a series of cinematic scenes, from zombie horrors to nature documentaries.

With their bodies engaging in combat with objects such as a pair of bellows, two halves of a coconut, and a plunger, they conjure up sounds in a playful and hallucinogenic experience.

The duo appropriates the Foley film sound technique, which is used to create sounds in a studio that cannot be captured on the live film set and harness it as a choreographic tool.

Don't miss this unique and mesmerizing performance that explores the relationship between movement, sound, and image.

Dag Taeldeman & Andrew Van Ostade (Belgium)

BodyBodyBodyBody is a journey to the edges of trance.

In this electrifying dance concert, percussive music impregnates our body until it contaminates it. As the intoxicating repetitive rhythms of Dag Taeldeman and Andrew Van Ostade merge with the haunting voice of soprano Lies Vandewege, the audience is entranced by the rhythmic gyrations of Sardinian dancer Matteo Sedda, rooted in the folk tradition of the Italian tarantella.

The magnetic oscillation between guitar, drums, voice and electrified bodies reaches an emotional peak that will leave you exhilarated.

BodyBodyBodyBody is a tidal wave of music and movement, drawing its evocative power from the magic of folk traditions and the propulsive power of Electro.

His superb debut album, *Stride*, was a commercial and critical hit, earning him a nomination for RTÉ Choice Music Award's Album of the Year.

JOHN FRANCIS FLYNN

John Francis Flynn is a leading figure in Ireland's folk music renaissance. The singer and multi-instrumentalist is a founding member of Skipper's Alley and a frequent collaborator with the likes of Ye Vagabonds and Lankum.

Rough Trade's River Lea label released his critically acclaimed debut album *I Would Not Live Always*. The album captivated folk fans and showcased Flynn's striking clarity of artistic vision. Rooted in traditional song, Flynn uses his source material to explore new musical territories, framing his rich, resonant voice in abstract drones and loops.

John Francis Flynn's live shows are intimate, emotionally charged experiences. This is going to be special.

The Carnival of Collective Joy returns to the streets of Carlow for Cruinniú na nÓg, in a celebration of the creative imagination of school children across County Carlow. Menzo's body serves as a canvas for exploring themes of race, gender and status: layer after layer, the performer unfolds and metamorphoses, challenging our preconceived notions and biases.

As the viewer grapples with a complex mix of emotions and ideas, including empathy and surprise, eroticism and exoticization, the piece asks us to reflect on how identities are constructed and the impact that cultural expectations can have on our understanding of ourselves and others.

This is a must-see for anyone interested in the intersection of art, culture, and equality.
